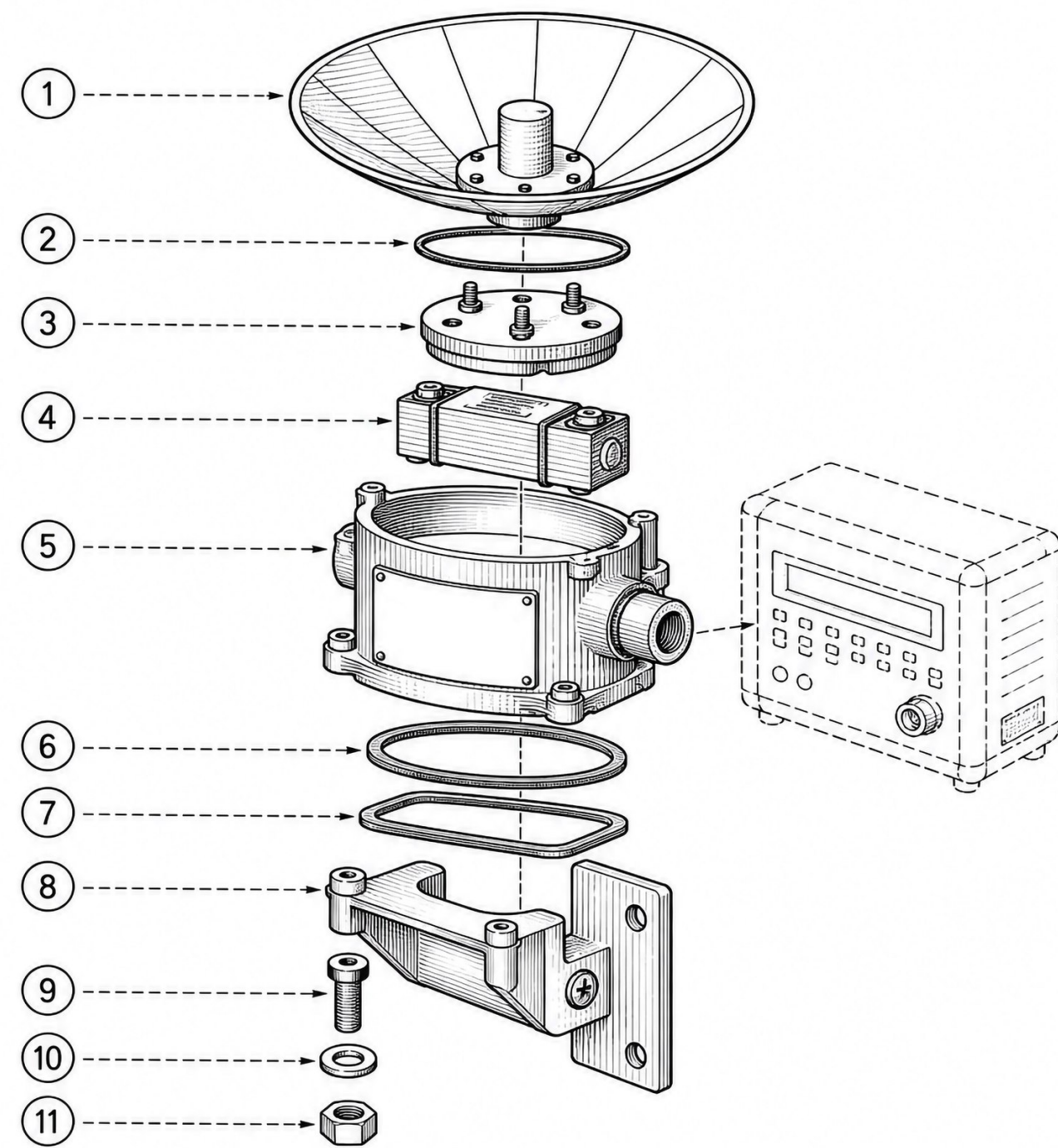

Thirty years in the auto parts industry taught the language before the art did. Exploded diagrams, bills of materials, item numbers, quantities, everything accounted for on paper. That world runs on the same document format it runs on promises: advancement dangled just out of reach, performance tied to a review cycle that moved every time you got close to it, loyalty repaid with a title change and nothing behind it. A relationship ran alongside it on the same timeline, the same fuel, and came apart the same way. Two systems, one language, both insisting everything was accounted for. Someone else is still standing inside that language now. I'm not.

An exploded diagram takes something whole and detonates it outward, every part suspended mid-blast, frozen just before it would either reassemble or scatter for good. That's the only honest way left to depict any of it. Not a wound. Not a eulogy. A controlled explosion, documented with the same cold precision that industry used to sell me on everything it never delivered. This series takes that format and points it back at what it's owed. What looks like documentation is closer to a settling of accounts, filed the only way that world ever taught me to file anything: cleanly, without comment, and for the last time.
